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## The Unique Basket-weave Cloth

Updated 4/09: pattern tweaked to be reversible. Errata in bold.
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This pattern is all about revamping something classic: a basket-weave stitch. You'll find this washcloth to be delightful to knit up because of its small \& large boxes interwoven together and because it's reversible!

Level: Easy
Materials:
Yarn: approx. 60-70 yds of a worsted weight Cotton yarn
Needles: Size 6US straight needles, 1 darning needle \& crochet needle "I"

Gauge: 5.5 sts \& 8 rows=1"<br>Cloth Measurements:73/4" wide $8^{\prime \prime}$ tall<br>Abbreviations: K=knit $\mathrm{P}=$ purl $\mathrm{CO}=$ cast on $\mathrm{BO}=$ bind off $\mathrm{Sts}=$ stitches $\mathrm{Yds}=y a r d s$




## WASHCLOTH DIRECTIONS:

CO 35 sts onto straight needles using your preferred cast-on method.

1. Seed stitch (*k1,p1,k1*) for 5 rows.
2. Follow the "Basket-weave Pattern" instructions 1-12 three times, plus rows 1-5.
3. Seed-stitch 4 more rows
4. BO loosely; don't cut the yarn if you're going to add a crocheted loop.
5. Crocheted loop: Slip the last remaining loop from your BO onto a crochet hook. Use the working yarn to single crochet a 2" loop at the corning of the washcloth. That's about 9-10 chains. Fold the loop \& secure with a knot into the wrong side of the cloth.
6. Weave in any ends into the wrong side of the cloth. Block, if necessary.

The Basket-weave Pattern:
Rows 1 \& 3 (RS): K1,p1,k1, *p5,k3* until last 3 sts; k1,p1,k1.
Rows 2 \& 4 (WS): K1,p1,k1, *k5, p3* until last 3 sts; k1,p1,k1.
Row 5: K1, p1, k1, knit straight across the row until the last 3sts; k1, p1,k1.
Rows 6, 8, 10: K1,p1,k1, *p5,k3* until last 3 sts; k1,p1,k1.
Rows 7, 9, 11: K1,p1,k1, *k5,p3* until last 3 sts; k1,p1,k1.
Row 12: K1, p1, k1, purl straight across the row until the last 3sts; k1,p1,k1.
